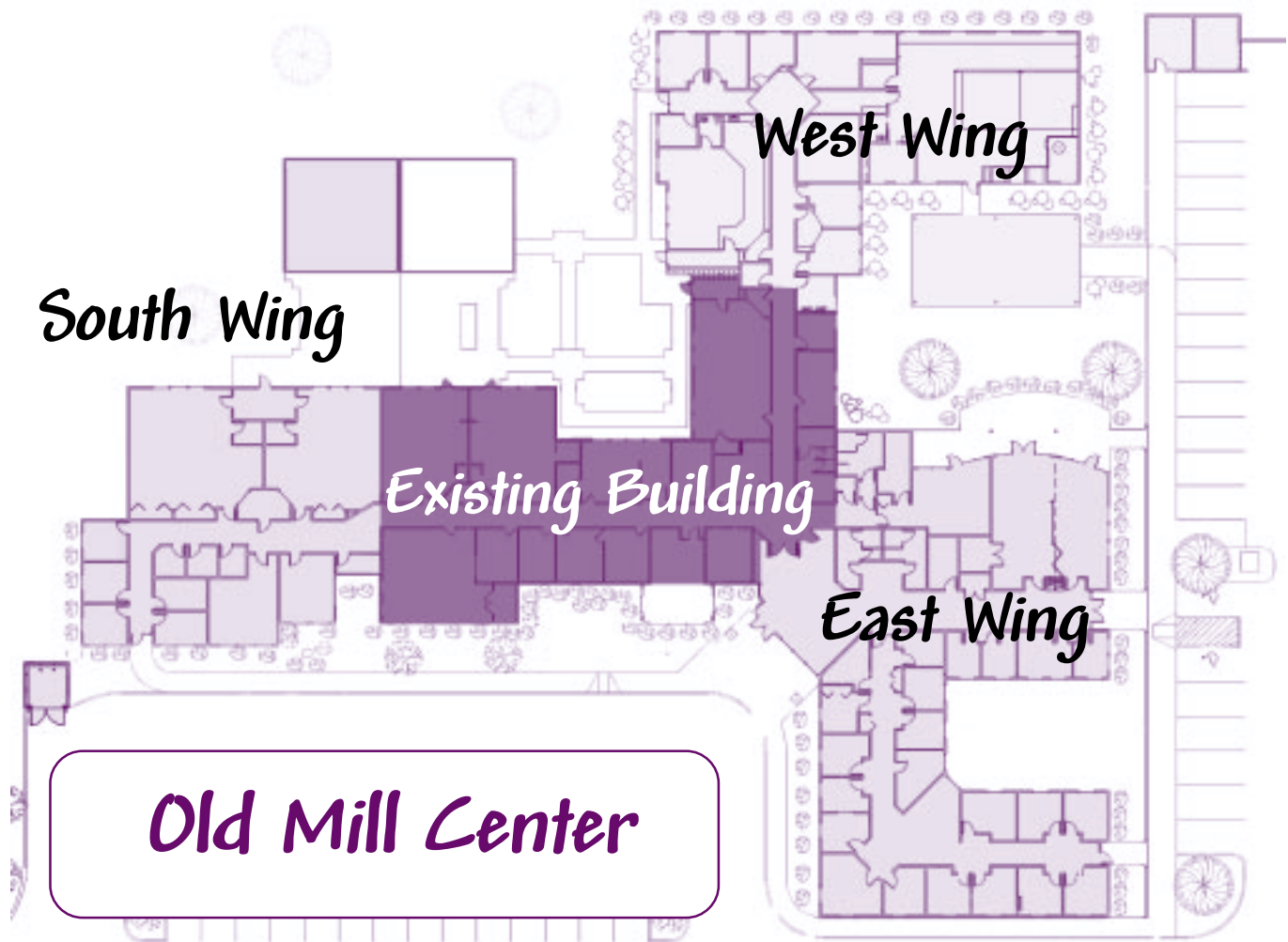

# Old Mill Center for Children and Families Sustainability Strategy for Expansion

Previously, our limited space was prioritized for contract-designated families, which were overwhelmingly low income with no insurance or Oregon Health Plan insurance. The additional space will allow Old Mill to increase services to families utilizing private insurance and other non-state supported funding. Operational sustainability has been addressed by providing space to 1) accommodate more clients and implement new programs; and 2) be proactive in meeting the regions unmet service needs and in meeting needs as they are identified. A Five Year Program Plan 2003-2008 served as the primary tool in the development and planning of the facility expansion.



## West Wing

**OT/PT/Speech Therapy \$1,235,000\***

The OT/PT/Speech wing was selected for expansion first due to its potential to be largely self-supporting. A waiting list for services exists, although no marketing plan has ever been implemented. A day treatment classroom for children ages 6-9 with emotional disorders is also included.

## East Wing

**Mental Health \$1,508,000\***

The mental health wing also has positive revenue potential and a waiting list. A conference room and library will provide flexible conference space to accommodate training for community childcare, mental health and social service professionals, and parent education and support groups. Contracts for services can be implemented for mediation, home studies, comprehensive assessment and evaluations of children, and expanded psychiatric services.

## South Wing

**Classrooms \$968,000\***

The construction of the classroom wing will coordinate with the expansion and state funding of services to young children, and a care program for high-risk infants and toddlers. The classroom space will also accommodate gaps in local services to infants and toddlers.
